Expectations play a role in how inflation actually shapes up, whichever school of economic thought you belong to or reject. Whether the government and the central bank are on top of the situation is an important determinant of those expectations. And this is something that the government leadership has control over, or should. A sense of helplessness, drift or of being behind the curve feeds inflationary expectations, pushing up actual levels of inflation in the future. The RBI's monetary actions have attracted the criticism that they have not been attracted the criticism that they have not been aggressive enough on inflation, but they have certainly been consistent, steadily withdrawing the extra accommodation extended to counter the post-Lehman slowdown. But the spat between the capital market and insurance regulators and the finance ministry's formal stamp of primacy in regulatory matters through the institution of the Financial Stability Development Council, in the wake of that spat, have dented the authority of the central bank. This has detrimental effects on inflationary expectations. A similar logic applies to the government as well. It is not just its actions directly on the price front that determine its credibility on that front. The paralysis of Parliament is not entirely in the government's hands, but the seeming sense of drift at the top

even in matters that call for no legislative decisions certainly does not help.
